I know that all of your guests, no matter how differently they may analyse the world and its problems, are united in wishing to emphasise this decisive but also creative continuity of thought and action on your part, just as they are certainly united in wishing to pay homage to the memory of Cabral himself.

may prefer to forget the aims and loyalties defined and inspired
by Cabral. You have nevr done so, and among the many singular and
