HE IS UNDETERRED BY AN APPARENT SETBACK OR BY DIFFERENCES AMONG THE NEW RULERS IN LISBON, ACCORDING TO INFORMED SOURCES HERE.

THE SOCIALIST LEADER, THROWN INTO JAIL 12 TIMES UNDER THE SALAZAR REGIME AND ONCE EXILED TO AN ATLANTIC ISLAND BY OUSTED PREMIER DR. MARCELLO CAETANO, DOES NOT GIVE UP EASILY.

HE PLANS TO PURSUE HIS PEACEMAKING EFFORTS BY ENLISTING SUPPORT FROM THE UNITED NATIONS AND FROM THE ORGANISATION FOR AFRICAN UNITY (O.A.U.), DESPITE THE SETBACK IN TALKS IN ALGIERS LAST WEEK WITH AFRICAN NATIONALIST GUERRILLAS FROM PORTUGUESE GUINEA.

THE NEGOTIATIONS, AIMED AT SECURING A CEASEFIRE IN PORTUGUESE GUINEA (GUINEA-BISSAU) AND OPENING A WAY TO SIMILAR AGREEMENTS IN THEBIGGER TERRITORIES OF MOZAMBIQUE AND ANGOLA, OPENED PROMISINGLY IN LONDON LAST MONTH.

NO DATE FOR A FURTHER MEETING WAS SET, AND THE ALGERIAN NEWS AGENCY REPORTED THERE HAD BEEN A +TOTAL COLLAPSE+ OF THE NEGOTIATIONS.

BUT INFORMED SOURCES HERE SAID THAT, THROUGH THE REPORTED DIFFICULTIES EXISTED, THE SITUATION WAS NOT IN FACT AS CATASTROPHIC AS IT APPEARED.

WHEN DR. SOARES MET THE P.A.I.G.C. NATIONALISTS IN LONDON, LED BY THE SELF-PROCLAIMED GUINEA-BISSAU REPUBLIC'S REPRESENTATIVE MAJOR PEDRO PIRES, AGREEMENT APPEARED CLOSE.

A FORMULA HAD BEEN DEVISED PROVIDING FOR A CEASEFIRE, A FORMAL DECLARATION THAT PORTUGAL WOULD GIVE DE JURE RECOGNITION TO THE GUINEA-BISSAU REBEL REPUBLIC, AND AN AGREEMENT THAT THE FUTURE OF THE CAPE VERDE ISLANDS WOULD BE DECIDED BY THE ISLANDERS THROUGH A PLEBISCITE.

BEFORE RETURNING TO ALGIERS FOR THE TALKS WITH THE P.A.I.G.C.

LAST THURSDAY, DR. SOARES HAD A CRUCIAL MEETING WITH PORTUGAL'S

PRESIDENT, GENERAL ANTONIO DE SPINOLA, AT WHICH HE MANAGED

TO OBTAIN A BRIEF WHICH OFFERED STILL FURTHER LATITUDE IN DEALINGS WITH THE AFRICAN NATIONALISTS.

INFORMED SOURCES SAID DR. SOARES WENT AS FAR AS OFFERING TO RESIGN IF PRESIDENT SPINOLA AND PORTUGAL'S PROVISIONAL COALITION CABINET DID NOT ENDORSE HIS PROPOSED LINE OF ACTION.

THE DECISIVE CABINET MEETING TOOK PLACE IN LISBON LAST WEDNESDAY AND DR. SOARES MET PRESIDENT SPINOLA, WHO GAVE HIM THE GREEN LIGHT, A FEW HOURS BEFORE FLYING TO ALGIERS.

THIS WAS A SIGNIFICANT VICTORY FOR THE SOCIALIST LEADER.

HIS MISSION HAD BEEN COMPLICATED BY A MAJOR SPEECH IN WHICH PRESIDENT SPINOLA, WHILE ADMITTING THAT THE DECOLONISATION PROGRAMME IMPLIED POLITICAL INDEPENDENCE FOR MOZAMBIQUE, ANGOLA AND GUINEA-BISSAU, INSISTED THAT SUCH A DECISION SHOULD ONLY FOLLOW DEMOCRATIC ELECTIONS IN THE TERRITORIES.

BUT A SECRET MEETING BETWEEN PRESIDENT SPINOLA AND THE GROUP OF ARMY OFFICERS WHO STAGED THE APRIL 25 COUP -- WHICH TOPPLED PORTUGAL'S COLONILIST AND AUTHORITARIAN REGIME -- CONFIRMED ANEW THE OFFICERS' RESOLVE TO SEEK A POLITICAL SOLUTION IN AFRICA.

THE CLUE TO THE BREAKDOWN OF THE ALGIERS TALKS, THE SOURCES SAID, CAN BE FOUND IN PUBLIC STATEMENTS AT THE ORGANISATION OF AFRICAN UNITY (O.A.U.) SUMMIT, WHICH WAS MEETING AT ABOUT THE SAME TIME IN MOGADISHU, SOMALIA.

AFRICAN DELEGATIONS PUT PRESSURE ON THE GUINEAN NATIONALISTS TO CLARIFY THEIR POSITION ON THE SOLUTION ENVISAGED FOR THE STRATEGIC CAPE VERDE ISLANDS, AND THEY INSISTED THAT PORTUGAL SHOULD AT THE OUTSET RECOGNISE THE ISLANDS' RIGHT TO INDEPENDENCE TOO. = /.943 -/JO/BJW

TODAY, PORTUGAL'S NEW RULERS ARE UNDERSTOOD TO BE SEEKING A CLARIFICATION OF WESTERN IDEAS ON THE IMPORTANCE OF THE ISLANDS.

OBSERVERS HERE BELIEVE THAT THIS WOULD BE ONE OF THE QUESTIONS WHICH PRESIDENT SPINOLA WILL PUT TO PRESIDENT NIXON WHEN THE LATTER STOPS OVER AT LAJES AIRBASE, IN THE AZORES, ON HIS WAY BACK TO THE U.S. FROM HIS MIDDLE EAST TOUR.

DR. SOARES WAS ALSO EXPECTED TO SOUND U.S. SECRETARY OF STATE HENRY KISSINGER DURING THE NATO FOREIGN MINISTERS MEETING AT OTTAWA, CANADA, THIS WEEK.

DR. SOARES ALSO PLANS TO MEET SHORTLY WITH UNITED NATIONS SECRETM GENERAL KURT WALDHEIM FOR THE SAME PURPOSE.

WHEN HE RETURNED FROM THE UNSUCCESSFUL ALGIERS TELKS, UNABLET TO ANNOUNCE EVEN A LIMITED CEASEFIRE AGREEMENT, DR. SOARES WAS ABLE HOWEVER TO REVEAL THAT THE TWO SIDES HAD AGREED AT LEAST ON ONE POINT -- THE NEED TO OBSERVE HENCEFORTH CONFIDENTIALITY IN THEIR TALKS UNTIL FINAL AGREEMENT WAS REACHED.

PORTUGUESE OFFICIALS BELIEVE THAT PRESS LEAKS ON THE INTENDED AGREEMENTS PROVOKED THE O.A.U. REACTIONS AND LED TO THE CURRENT STALEMATE IN THE TALKS.

MEANWHILE, LEADERS OF MOZAMBIQUE'S AFRICAN NATIONALIST LIBERATION MOVEMENT FRELIMO, WHO HAD SCHEDULED A SECOND MEETING WITH DR. SOARES NEXT MONTH DEPENDING ON THE OUTCOME OF HIS TALKS WITH THE P.A.I.G.C. HAVE REJECTED PRESIDENT SPINOLA'S PROPOSAL TO SUBJECT THEIR RIGHT TO INDEPENDENCE TO DEMOCRATIC ELECTIONS IN MOZAMBIQUE.

THIS RESOLVE BY THE YOUNG OFFICERS, WHO WITH THEIR COUP PUT AN END TO 48 YEARS OF AUTHORITARIAN RULE IN THE METRPOLIS, REMAINS TODAY THE PILLAR OF POLITICAL STABILITY IN PORTUGAL.

THE ARMY HAS INDICATED PLAINLY THAT IT DOES NOT WISH TO FIGHT ANY LONGER IN ORDER TO PRESERVE THE WORLD'S LAST SURVIVING COLONIAL EMPIRE. AS LONG AS THIS DECISION STANDS - IN SPITE OF FRICTIONS - THE DEMOCRATIC CTALITION IN PORTUGAL IS EXPECTED TO REMAIN UNBROKEN, TOGETHER WITH HOPE FOR A SOLUTION IN AFRICA IN THE FORESEEABLE FUTURE.
